





- Directionality: Align public and private stakeholders around shared goals (e.g., Green Deal, digital transition).
- Multi-Level Governance: Engage regional, national, and European levels for comprehensive collaboration.
- Horizon Integration: Facilitate cross-border collaboration and knowledge exchange.
- Holistic Approach: Promote co-creation and joint ownership among all stakeholders.

- Resource Allocation: Coordinated funding for impactful innovation projects.







































COUNTRIES INCLUDED IN ERA_FABRIC
